Day 1: TORONTO - DELHI

Today you will board your flight to Delhi.

Day 2: ARRIVAL IN DELHI

Arrive Delhi, clear immigration and customs and proceed towards the visitor's gallery, where our representative will be holding a placard for you to assist and transfer you to your hotel.

Delhi, the capital of India has a fascinating history and a stimulating present. Delhi has been the seat of a power of a number of dynasties – the Rajputs, the Muslims invaders from the North, the Afghan dynasties followed by Tughlaqs, Sayyads, the Lodi and the Mughals, who continued the Imperial line, until British days. **The old city**, built by Shah Jahan in the 17th century, stands today as an epitome of the whole history of Indo-Islamic architecture. New Delhi, designed and constructed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and Sir Herbert Baker is a mixture of east and west. The public buildings in red sandstone are in the Mughal style. **New Delhi**, has a circular Parliament House and an imposing Central Secretariat in two blocks, which stand at the approaches to *Rashtrapati Bhavan*, the residence of the President of India. Delhi is today the political, economic and cultural capital of the world's largest democracy and has also become one of the greatest tourist centers of the world.

Overnight: The Oberoi Hotel New Delhi

The hotel is equipped with new, clean air technology which promises the cleanest air in the city. All rooms feature large picture windows which frame unmatched views of the Delhi Golf Course on one side and the historical Humayun's Tomb on the other. Rooms have teakwood floors, walk-in closets, luxury Italian marble bathrooms, complimentary high speed Internet for up to four devices, international television news channels and a selection of latest movies. A butler service and in room dining will be available 24 hours a day.



Wellness facilities include temperature controlled indoor and outdoor swimming pool, The Oberoi Spa and a 24 hour fitness centre. The threesixty° offers all-day dining restaurant, a contemporary Indian restaurant and a rooftop Chinese restaurant. There is also an open-air rooftop bar serving champagne, cocktails and tapas. The temperature controlled wine cellar at the Lobby level offers specially curated selection of fine wines and champagnes. The Club Bar serves a wide range of premium alcoholic beverages and the Cigar Lounge offers the finest selection of cigars.

Day 3: DELHI

Breakfast at the hotel.

Later, meet your local guide in the hotel lobby and depart for a guided sightseeing tour of **Old Delhi** to visit:

Jama Masjid: this is one of the largest mosques in India, and a sight of historical importance. Begun in 1644, the mosque was not completed until 1658. It has three gateways, four angle towers and two minarets standing 40m high and constructed of alternating vertical strips of red sandstone and white marble.



Enjoy a cycle **rickshaw ride** through the **Chandani Chowk market**. We then **drive past the Red Fort (stop for photo from outside)**, built in red sand stone are the walls of Lal Quila. The Red Fort extends for 2 km and varies in height from 18m on the river side to 33m on the city side. Shah Jahan started construction of the massive fort in 1638 and it was completed in 1648.

Later visit the **Raj Ghat**, the place where Mahatma Gandhi was put to rest.

Continue drive to **Connaught Place** - Connaught Place is a frenetic business and financial hub, centered on a ring of colonnaded Georgian-style buildings with global chain stores, vintage cinemas, bars and Indian restaurants. Stalls at Janpath Market sell saris, embroidered bags and trinkets.

Tour ends with a visit to 'Akshardham Temple & Water Show' with guide.

Akshardham Temple (closed on Mondays): The Akshardham Temple is one of the most recently built temples in Delhi. Constructed by the Bochasanvasi Aksharpurushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS), it is situated on the banks of the River Yamuna. Delhi Akshardham Mandir was inaugurated in November'05 in the presence of President APJ Abdul Kalam. It is spread over an area of 100 acres and took about two years to complete.



Evening enjoy a multimedia water show – '**Sahaj Anand**'

Show Timings: First show starts soon after sunset. (Currently 19:00 hrs)

Shows : Two shows may be held during weekends or public holidays.

Duration : 24 minutes

Return to the hotel for a complimentary dinner.

Day 4: DELHI

Breakfast at the hotel.

This morning meet your local guide in the hotel lobby and depart for a guided half-day sightseeing tour of New Delhi to visit:

Humayun's Tomb (Tomb of Mughal Emperor Humayun) - built in the mid-16th century by Haji Begum, the Persian-born senior wife of Humayun, the second Mughal emperor, this is a wonderful early example of Mughal architecture.



Drive past **India Gate** (War memorial), the **President's House** which was once the Viceroy's Palace, **Parliament House** and **Secretarial buildings**.

Later visit the **Qutab Minar** - 234 feet high tower, the Qutab Minar itself is a soaring tower of victory that was started in 1193, immediately after the defeat of the last Hindu kingdom in Delhi. It is nearly 73m high and tapers from a 15m diameter base to just 2.5m at the top. The tower has five distinct stories, each marked by a projecting balcony. The first three storeys are made of red sandstone, the fourth and the fifth of marble and sandstone.

Day 5: DELHI - VARANASI Flight: 9W 2423 Dep. at 10:55 am and Arr. at 12:10pm

Early breakfast at the hotel.

8:30 am check out and meet your driver in the hotel lobby and you will be transferred to airport to board flight for Varanasi.

Arrive Varanasi and walk towards the exit hall where our local representative will be paging for you to assist and transfer you to the hotel.

Varanasi is the world's most ancient city and the home of Hinduism. The present name is derived from the fact that it is at the confluence of the two rivers *Varuna* and *Asi* that flow across the city. To the Hindus, **Varanasi** is the holiest city, with its array of shrines, temples and palaces rising in several tiers from the water's edge. Varanasi is one of the most fascinating cities in the east. It is also a city of fairs and festivals, celebrating about four hundred of them during the year. Since time immemorial, Varanasi has been a center of learning and the tradition is kept alive today by the Banaras Hindu University (BHU) founded in 1916.



After check-in proceed for excursion tour to **"Sarnath"** – The ancient Buddhist learning center of Sarnath. Here, Gautama Buddha preached his first sermon to his disciples as portrayed in Bernardo Bertolucci's film "Little Buddha." We then visit the **Sarnath Museum (remains closed on Fridays)** which houses some of the greatest treasures of Indian Buddhist art, including Lion Capital of Ashoka, the Sarnath museum has a small but awe-inspiring collection of Buddhist artifacts. Among the things to see is a beautiful sculpture of the Buddha from the



fifth century.

In the evening drive to the Ghat to see the **Aarti ceremony**. As the sun sets the temple priests perform Aarti, the sacred "light ceremony", on the banks Mother Ganges.

Overnight: Nadesar Palace

Over the years, royalty and celebrities have stayed in the luxurious and spacious rooms at Nadesar Palace. Featuring four-poster beds and traditional furnishings, all come with a flat-screen TV, DVD player and minibar. Large marble ancient Indian methods are used at Jiva Spa, which provides aromatherapy massage, body scrubs and other beauty treatments. The Palace Butlers can help guests arrange yoga classes, golf games and river cruises. A daily breakfast can be enjoyed at the sun terrace. There are also pool-side barbecue dinners in the evenings.

Day 6: VARANASI

05.30 am depart for a boat ride on the Ganges.

Early morning, boat ride on holy river Ganges – to see the ritual bathing and cremation. It is worth the effort at waking up before sunrise, a direct contact with life on the banks of the Ganges. This is a soul stirring experience as you witness the performance of various rituals, laundry & cremations in the background of the rising Sun.



We also have an opportunity to walk the narrow streets which are preserved as they were centuries ago and visit the famous Kashi temple.

Return to the hotel for breakfast.

Later depart for guided sightseeing tour to visit the largest and oldest university in north India - **Banaras Hindu University (BHU)**. The university also has the huge Vishwanath temple which was built and maintained by the Birla family. The Banaras Hindu University has Bharat Kala Museum, which has a very rich collection of precious and rare historical manuscripts. **Durga Temple**, better known as the Monkey temple because of the large number of monkeys residing there. The temple was built in the 18th century. According to legend, the present statue of Goddess Durga was not made by man but appeared on its own in the temple. The architecture is of a Nagara style, which is typical of North India. The temple has a rectangular tank of water called the Durga Kund ("Kund" meaning a pond or pool.) The temple has multi-tiered spires and is stained red with ochre, representing the red colour of Durga. The Kund was initially connected directly to the river thus the water was automatically replenished. This channel was later closed, locking off the water supply, which is replenished only by rain or drainage from the Temple.

Also visit The temple "**Bharat Mata Temple**" is dedicated to Mother India. This temple is built in the Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapeeth. It was inaugurated by Mahatma Gandhi in 1936 so that the citizens

could respect Mother India in statue form which is built in marble. The statue is a replica of undivided India in three dimensions which has the mountains, plains and oceans in right proportion.

Overnight: Nadesar Palace

Day 7: VARANASI – DELHI

Flight: SG 2196 8:20am-10:25am

DELHI - AGRA Drive: 220 kms/4 hrs (approx.)

Carry packed breakfast from hotel.

6:00 am check out and meet our local representative in the hotel lobby for your transfer to airport to board flight for Delhi.

Arrive Delhi, proceed towards exit gate and meet our local representative who will be paging for you to assist and you will depart by road to Agra.

Arrive Agra and check in at the hotel.

Agra, located on the banks of the river Yamuna, Agra is famous around the world as the ‘City of the Taj’.

In the evening enjoy a complimentary sundowner at hotel.

Overnight: The Oberoi Amarvilas

Set 1.3 km from the Taj Mahal, this upscale, luxe hotel is also 4.2 km from the red sandstone Agra Fort and 4.7 km from Jama Masjid mosque. The chic, ornate rooms and suites all feature views of the Taj Mahal along with free Wi-Fi for upto four devices, flat-screen TVs and marble bathrooms. They also have sitting areas. Room service is available 24-hours.

Day 8: AGRA

5:30 am depart for **Taj Mahal** visit at the time of sunrise (Subject to weather condition).

The world famous **Taj Mahal (closed on Fridays)** during sunrise - symbol of eternal love, which stands on the banks of River Yamuna. It was built by the 5th Mughal Emperor, Shah Jahan in the year 1631 in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It was completed in 22 years. The Taj Mahal is widely recognized as “the jewel of Muslim art in India”



and one of the universally admired masterpieces of the world's heritage. It is regarded by many as the finest example of Mughal architecture, a style that combines elements from Persian and Indian architectural styles. In 1983, the Taj Mahal became a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

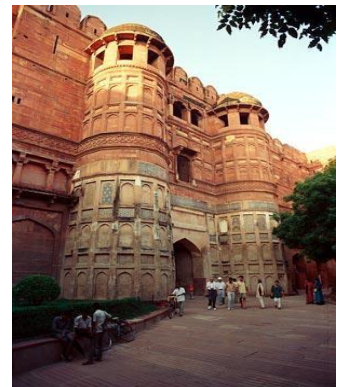
That been said, the Taj is at its most alluring in the relative quiet of early morning, shrouded in mists and bathed with a soft red glow. As its vast marble surfaces fall into shadow or reflect the sun, its colour changes, from soft grey and yellow to pearly cream and dazzling white; it's well worth visiting at different times. This play of light is an important decorative device, symbolically implying the presence of Allah, who is never represented in anthropomorphic form.

The moods of the Taj vary from dawn to dusk. The Taj Mahal or the Crown of Palaces looks milky white in the soft light that characterizes early morning, while the afternoon sun makes it glisten bright and dazzling in the overhead sunlight, almost looking like a jewel against the opaque blue of the skyline and then comes a moonlit Taj breaking into the night sky, majestic and simply beautiful in a sense that cannot be put into words. It is at this time that it shines like a pearl. **(A visit to the Taj Mahal at dawn or dusk is an unforgettable experience)**

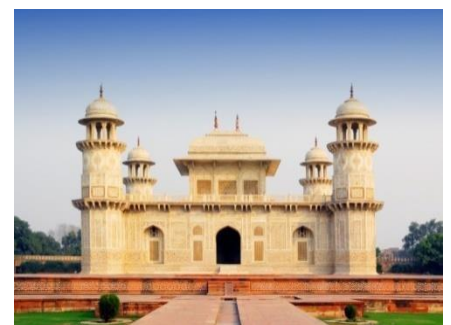
Return to hotel for Breakfast.

Later proceed with guide to visit Agra Fort:

Agra Fort - Agra is not only famous for the Taj Mahal but the impressive Mughal Red Fort known as the Agra Fort. The city built by Emperor Akbar and beautified with palaces and gardens by Jahangir is dominated by Agra Fort. The crescent-shaped fort is enclosed by its 20-metre high, 2.4 km long outer walls. The fort contains a maze of buildings forming a small city within a city. One enters the fort through the Amar Singh Gate, into the southern part of the fort which includes nearly all the buildings of tourist interest. Jahangir's palace commissioned by Akbar was the largest private residence in the fort. The Diwan-i-Aam (hall of public audience) and Diwan-i-Khas (hall of private audience) were built by Shahjahan for receiving audiences. Musamman Burj, an octagonal tower, stands close to Diwan-i-Khas.



Itmad-ud-Daula Tomb (also known as **BABY TAJ**) – The interiors of which are considered better than the Taj. One of the most beautiful Mughal tombs, Itmad-Ud-Daulah's Tomb was built by Nur Jahan, the Empress of Jahangir for her father in 1628. The tomb is a resting place of the powerful personality in Mughal Court, Itmad-Ud-Daulah, whose life is very interesting, formerly a very poor Persian merchant then named Mirza Ghiyas or Ghiyas Beg he became a minister and a trusted treasure in Akbar's court. After Akbar's death in 1605, his son Jahangir rose into power. Jahangir made Ghiyas Beg his chief minister and honored him with the title of Itmad-Ud-Daulah, the Pillar of State. Later, Jahangir met a beautiful daughter of Ghiyas Beg named Mehr-Un-Nissa and married her. Mehr-Un-Nissa soon played a significant role in the Jahangir's



court and was called Nur Mahal, the light of the Palace. Owing to her influence, her father and brother were granted with privileges in the court. When Ghiyas Beg (Itmad-Un-Daulah) dies in 1622, Nur Mahal decided to build a mausoleum for him. Queen Mumtaz Mahal or the lady of the Taj was also from this prevailing family. The mausoleum is entirely made of white marble and graced with intricate decoration of inlay work, and marble-screen work belonging to the Islamic style. With its tranquil, small garden on the bank of Yamuna River, the tomb stands impressively elegant from a distance.

In the evening again depart to visit the world famous **Taj Mahal** during Sunset (subject to weather conditions).

Your guide will also take you to local market named '**Kinari Bazaar**' - The narrow tapestry behind the Jama Masjid is an overcrowded maze of vibrant markets. The area is known as Kinari Bazaar as many lanes fan out from the Kinari Bazaar road. It is a colorful market dotted with a number of shops each specializing in different wares. Simply walking down the streets will be an experience to enjoy and cherish for the lifetime.

Overnight: The Oberoi Amarvilas

Day 9: AGRA - RANTHAMBHORE

Drive: 265 kms/5-6 hrs (approx.)

Breakfast at the hotel.

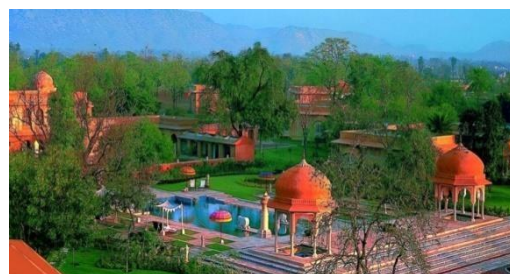
7:00 am check out and meet your driver in the hotel lobby and depart for Ranthambhore and upon arrival, check in at your hotel.

Ranthambhore National Park or Sawai Madhopur is known to have India's Friendliest tigers Assured of protection; these nocturnal creatures are seen often in the day. Sprawled on the Aravalli and Vindhya ranges of Rajasthan, Ranthambore National Park encompasses an area of 410 SQ km in which lives a healthy population of about 40 tigers. A large number of deer inhabit the area and leopards are occasionally sighted. Mammals: Tiger, Panther, Hyena, Jackal , Jungle Cat , Caracal , Sloth Bear, Sambar, Chital, Nilgai, Wild Boar, Chinkara, Indian hare mongoose. Birds: Bonelli's eagle, crested serpent eagle, great Indian horned owl, grey partridge sandgrouse, quail, spurfowl, common peafowl, tree pie, paradise flycatcher, pheasant tailed jacana, painted stork, black stork, spoonbill, green pigeon and ducks.



Overnight: The Oberoi Vanyavilas

Set amid 8 hectares of gardens, this refined hotel featuring luxury tents is 1.8 km from the Shilpgram museum and 9 km from Ranthambore Fort. The elegant rooms in luxe tents with wood floors offer free Wi-Fi and air-conditioning (no TVs). All rooms have 4-poster beds, sitting areas and terraces, plus en suite bathrooms with free-



standing baths. Room service is also available.

Return back to hotel for breakfast and rest of the Morning is at leisure. In the afternoon depart for your second park safari.

Day 11: RANTHAMBHORE - JAIPUR

Drive: 150 kms/3 hrs (approx.)

Breakfast at the hotel.

In time, check out, meet your driver and depart by road to Jaipur and check in at hotel.

Jaipur: The rose-pink capital of Rajasthan is surrounded on all sides by rugged hills, crowned with forts and enclosed by embattled walls. The Maharaja's palace stands in the centre of the city amidst lovely gardens. Houses with latticed windows line the streets, their rose-pink colour lending enchantment to the scene which is almost magical at sunset. Jaipur is aptly called the 'Pink City of India'. It takes its name from the famous Maharana Sawai Jai Singh, who founded the city in 1728.

Jaipur is noted for its craft men skilled in the art of cutting precious stones and famed for its garnets and rubies. It is equally well known for brass inlay work, lacquer work and the printing of muslins. The City Palace which now houses a museum containing rare manuscripts, paintings and an armoury; the Observatory with a sundial 90 ft. high; the Museum amidst the Ram Niwas Palace Gardens founded in 1876 with a large collection of antiques; the Palace of Winds a landmark of Jaipur made of pink sand stone and of unique design.

In the evening enjoy a unique experience at the resort: Experience a traditional 'aarti', the Hindu ritual of offering prayers by fire, at our 18th century Lord Shiva temple. Nestled upon a small island and reached by bridge across a beautiful lily pond, the temple is an indescribably tranquil location for guests to experience this traditional ceremony. Combine Aarti Puja ceremony with a private yoga session, for the ultimate Oberoi experience. Timing: 15 minutes, 8.00am and **6.30pm** every day – subject to change due weather.

Later, enjoy a complimentary dinner at hotel.

Overnight: The Oberoi Rajvilas

The Oberoi Rajvilas is a royal resort set in a breathtaking thirty two acre oasis of beautiful landscaped gardens, filled with exotic birdlife. 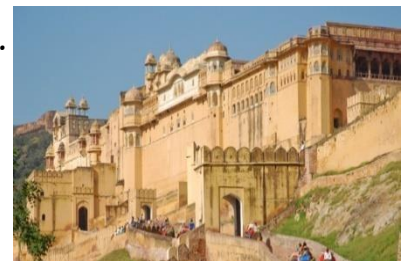


Day 12: JAIPUR

Breakfast at the hotel.

8:30 am meet your local guide in the hotel lobby and depart for a guided full day sightseeing tour of Jaipur.

Proceed to visit the **Amber Fort** (the former capital of the Royal Rajputs). Ascend the fort on Elephant back or jeep ride. Few fail to be moved by the dramatic Rajput grandeur of this hilltop fortress-palace 11-km north of Jaipur. Set on the dry wrinkled Aravali Hills, and surrounded by fortified battlements, the palace straddles two sepia-hued tundra hills overlooking Maota Lake, and its sprawling crenellated walls lattice the surrounding hills.



In the afternoon visit **Jaipur City**:

Hawa Mahal or Palace of the Winds, a five-storied structure of pink sand stone with semi-octagonal and delicately honeycombed windows overlooking the main street of the old city. It was built in 1799 so that veiled royal woman could peer down unseen by the world through its 593 stone screens.



City Palace & Museum. The City Palace in the heart of the old city is a blend of Rajasthani and Mughal architecture. The center of the palace is a seven storied building called Chandra Palace, with fine views over the gardens and the city.



Solar Observatory - an astronomical treasure house, with solar devices that still give accurate predictions.

Rest of the evening is free for independent activities.



Optional:

- **Evening cultural program, cooking demo and dinner with Indian family.**
- **Sound & Light Show at Amber Fort with dinner at Nahargarh Fort** - A light and sound show at Amber Fort and a fine dining experience is this package introducing to you which brings forth some good moments in a beautiful location. Pick up from your hotel in the early evening around 6:00 PM and drive to Amber Fort, witness light and sound show and later drive to Nahargarh & enjoy dinner with eagle view of the pink city in a palace converted into a Hotel, Once Upon a Time in Nahargarh.

Day 13: JAIPUR - JODHPUR

Drive: 330 kms / 6-7 hrs (approx.)

Early breakfast at the hotel.

Check out, collect your **packed lunch from hotel** and meet your driver in the hotel lobby for your drive to Jodhpur.

Arrive Jodhpur and check in at hotel.

Jodhpur stands on a range of sandstone hills surrounded by a strong wall nearly 10 kms in length, with seven gates. Dominating the city is an eminence surmounted by a massive fortress. In olden days, the fortress must have been well-nigh impregnable, for the rocky base on which it is built is scraped on every side. Within the walls are royal palaces with priceless jewels and a striking collection of arms.

In the evening enjoy **Umaid Bhawan Palace** tour organized by hotel for resident guest-Maharaja Umaid Songhai who built this palace was fascinated with western lifestyles so he marshaled the services of a well-known Edwardian architect, Henry Vaughan Lanchester, a creditable equal of Edward Lutyens (architect of New Delhi) to construct a three hundred and forty seven roomed Umaid Palace. This was to become India last of the great palaces and the biggest private residence in the world.

Overnight: The Umaid Bhawan Palace

Every room at this hotel is air conditioned and is equipped with a flat-screen TV with satellite channels and DVD player. Certain rooms have a sitting area to relax in after a busy day. All rooms are fitted with a private bathroom. For your comfort, you will find bathrobes and slippers. The hotel has an outdoor pool and fitness center, and guests can enjoy a meal at the restaurant. There is also a hairdresser's at the property.

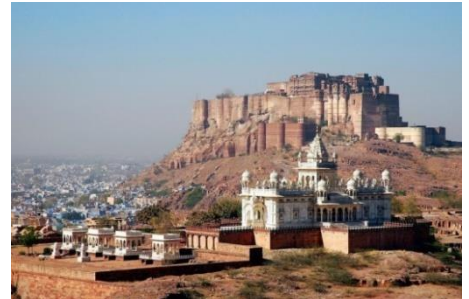
Day 14: JODHPUR

Breakfast at the hotel.

Later proceed for guided half-day sightseeing tour to visit the imposing **Mehrangarh Fort**, within the walls is royal palace with priceless jewels and a striking collection of arms.

Jaswant Thada is an imposing marble memorial built in 1899.

Continue your drive to **Rohet** for lunch.



After lunch, enjoy **Village Jeep Safari**, Rohet's signature program and one of our main highlights.

This cultural safari was pioneered by the house of Rohet twenty seven years ago. It showcases rural India in its entire splendor. The 'Village Safari' enables guests to experience life in the villages and offers an opportunity to interact with the local folk. Guests have called it the highlight of their trip to India, as the 'Safari' brings them up close and personal with the real India that lives in the villages. It takes them back to their roots and changes their very conception of India. The warmth of the people, the fantastic traditional costumes of the different communities with all the vibrant colors that Rajasthan is so famous for, the diversity amongst the different communities, and the peace and harmony in diversity that is the essence of India, the aesthetics of their beautiful rustic architecture and the incredible levels of hygiene, and most of all, the underlying spirituality that touches the core of the heart makes 'The Village Safari' the most memorable moment of the India experience for most.

In the evening enjoy a short walk through the local and vibrant bazaar of Jodhpur. The Sardar Market is located near the clock tower in the city and is quite famous for its textiles in different prints, leather footwear and artifacts. Apart from exploring the local markets, the astonishing arts & crafts will give you a brief overview about the city's true essence.

Overnight: The Umaid Bhawan Palace

Day 15: JODHPUR - UDAIPUR (via Ranakpur) Drive: 295 kms/6-7 hrs (approx.)

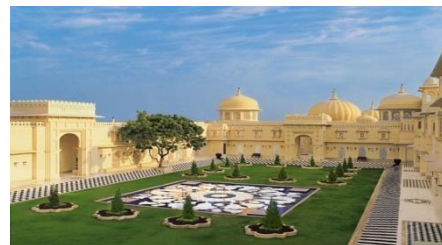

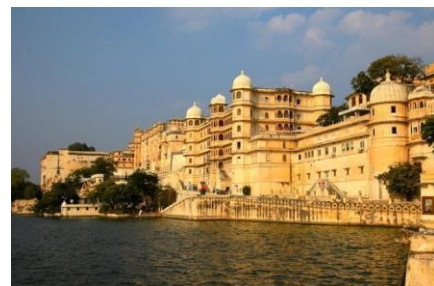

5. Changes: Flights offered by Tourcan Vacations are conducted in accordance with the applicable tariffs of the air carrier and pursuant to regulations set out by the Canadian Transportation Agency. All such flights and rates are also subject to approval by the relevant government authorities. Consolidations and changes in the published schedule, aircraft type, days of operation, air carrier providing air transportation and flight itinerary may be undertaken at any time and without prior notice, in accordance with the air carrier's tariffs.

Fares and Names: Fares and taxes may increase between the time of quoting, booking and tickets being issued.

The fares quoted are subject to class availability and may have booking conditions attached.

Tickets must reflect the passengers name as shown in their passport. If names are not reflected correctly boarding may be denied.

Schedule Check and Connecting Flights: Flight schedules are subject to change without notice. Customers having purchased air only must reconfirm their return flight within 24 to 72 hours prior to the scheduled take-off time. Tourcan Vacations undertakes to notify customers reasonably in advance through means it deems appropriate of any schedule changes resulting in the advancement or delay of the flight departure times or in case of cancellation of a flight. Whenever customers book connecting flights, they must allow sufficient time to make their connection. No control can be exercised over air carriers to guarantee flight schedules, which may be altered or affected by various circumstances. Tourcan Vacations will not be liable for any change of schedule or a missed flight connection, including any additional fees incurred and special, incidental or consequential damages (including the carriage of baggage) arising from the foregoing, whether or not it had the knowledge that such additional fees or damages might be incurred.

Airport check-in: It is recommended that customers arrive at the airport check-in counter at least 3 hours prior to departure. Failing this, their reservation may be cancelled and their seats assigned to other customers, with no right of recourse.

Seat assignment: unless already pre-assigned, staff at the air carrier's check-in counter conducts aircraft seating.

12. VALIDITY OF TICKETS: Tickets are made out in the name of the customer and are not transferable. Tickets are valid only on the dates and flights indicated. Unused portions of tickets may not be used for travel on other flights and are not subject to refund at any time.

13. BAGGAGE:

Limits: Air carriers have individual rules and regulations with respect to baggage weight, size and number. Customers must consult with the travel agent for applicable restrictions.

- * An Act of God or Force Majeure;
- * A war, revolution, insurrection, riot, blockage or any other unlawful act against public order or authority, including an act of terrorism or threat thereof;
- * Fire, flood, explosion, earthquake, epidemics, quarantine, storm, lightning, tornado or adverse weather conditions generally;
- * Accident to or failure of an aircraft or equipment used in connection therewith, loss of or hijacking of an aircraft, or any shortage of or inability to provide labor, fuel or facilities;
- * Any strike, lock-out, labor dispute or other industrial disturbance whether involving Tourcan Vacations' employees, the employees of its service providers or others upon whom Tourcan Vacations relies;
- * Any government order, regulation, action or inaction or any failure to obtain the approval of a government authority having jurisdiction in the circumstances as may be required to the conduct of operations hereunder or any government or legal restraint upon such operation;

Travel Services provided are subject to the conditions imposed by the service providers and their liability is limited by their tariffs, conditions of carriage, tickets, vouchers, international conventions and agreements.

23. ACTIVITIES NOT INCLUDED: Tourcan Vacations shall not be liable for the quality or safety of activities (such as excursions, optional tours, little extras and others) available at the destination that customers may wish to participate in and which are not included in the package, nor for any other representation made by the operator of any such activities. Any written or oral contract for all such activities shall be deemed to be made between customers and the operator of such activities and shall be undertaken at the customers' own risk of loss, damage or injury. Tourcan Vacations shall not be liable in any manner for any complaints or claims that may arise as a result of participation in any such activities which are offered by third parties over whom Tourcan Vacations has no control.

24. CONFIDENTIALITY: Tourcan Vacations strictly complies with principles of confidentiality with respect to customers' personal information, including in accordance with the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act.

25. LAWS: The laws of the province in which the Canadian gateway city is located govern this agreement. Any legal action instituted against Tourcan Vacations must be heard before the courts of this province. For the purposes of any such proceedings, the parties hereby agree to elect domicile in the judicial district of the Canadian gateway city in question. The voiding of one or other of the clauses hereto shall neither annul nor invalidate this agreement, which is known as the Terms and Conditions. Tourcan Vacations is registered as a wholesaler in Ontario.
